OFFICER'S REPORTS: Marshall stated that using the drop box for tax collection worked well. Everyone received a receipt that used the drop box. Lasher attended the MTA training conference and spoke about some changes that are being proposed in legislation. Lasher received a call in regards to an inquiry on the Townships stance on medical marijuana. Gibbs stated that CMS had contracted him and that the cable connection is available to residents as the project is being completed. Absentee ballots have been going out to the residents and that there


will be a primary and general election in the year of 2019 due to the fact that Judge Chamberlain is retiring.
